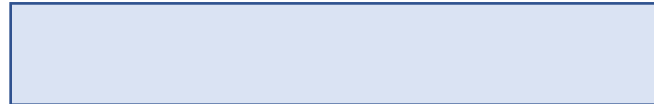

Speakers: Update on our Dominican Republic Projects

This spring marked our 8th yearly trip, and we are truly changing the lives of the people in the villages we have adopted! Our grant projects, with other RCs, include: **Loma Bahita**: a slum village with 150 Haitians living in shacks - we have provided clothing, toiletries, school supplies, and a kitchen for their schoolhouse. **San Marcos**: we have provided a 4th school - taught by a New Horizon young adult we sponsored for her education! The school teaches reading for the children AND their parents as educating mothers = educating the whole family! Other projects and donations from our team of Rotary Clubs include water projects: an aqueduct, water lines and home biosand filters where clean water cannot be brought in. Concrete floors have been provided for families living on packed soil. The results are outstanding! Homesteaders have gained pride in their communities and now care about amenities such as trash collection, and new paved roads are being built by the government to the settlements! 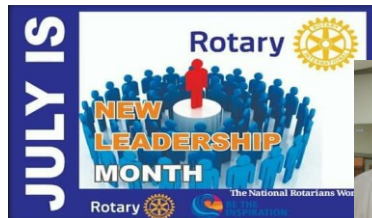
